Punctuality Drive Update

We are now two weeks into our punctuality drive and the implementation of our clear line in the sand around this important area. While we are pleased to report a significant improvement in punctuality to lessons, we acknowledge there is still work to be done to reach our goals.

In the first week of the initiative, we focused on raising awareness and fostering understanding, rather than immediately enforcing catch-up sessions. During this time, we emphasised the importance of punctuality to students and collaborated with parents and carers to reinforce this message. Despite some improvement compared to the previous term, students collectively lost 44 hours and 28 minutes of learning due to lateness to lessons.

During the second week, we introduced catch-up sessions for continued lateness, which led to another noticeable improvement. The total learning time lost dropped to 29 hours and 1 minute, marking a positive reduction. While this progress is encouraging, it also underscores the ongoing importance of prioritising punctuality and its significant impact on learning outcomes.

To support punctuality while accommodating practical needs, students are expected to arrive on time for all lessons, with a 3-minute grace period provided for transitions between classes. This approach ensures adequate time for movement while promoting punctuality and maintaining classroom discipline.

We remain committed to helping students develop good habits and valuing every minute of learning time. Thank you for your continued support in reinforcing the importance of punctuality at home.
